Doshie Loyd-Chandler, age 87, resident of Coweta went to be with her Lord and Savior Thursday evening, October 31, 2019 at her home in Coweta, OK surrounded by her family. She graduated as Valedictorian of her graduating class at Claremore High School in Claremore, OK. She went to Northeastern State University where she graduated with her Master's Degree in Library and English. Doshie was an English Professor and Librarian at Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Rogers State University in Claremore, Tulsa University, Oklahoma State University, and taught for 30 years at East Central High School in Tulsa. Doshie and her late husband, William "Doc" Jamison Chandler enjoyed their home in Western Colorado where they entertained their Oklahoma friends, family, and "locals" all summer.
