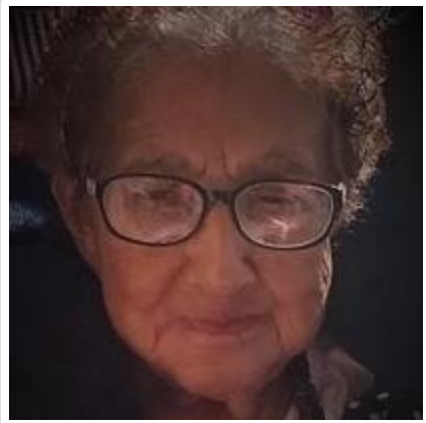




Hellen Lee Fair
