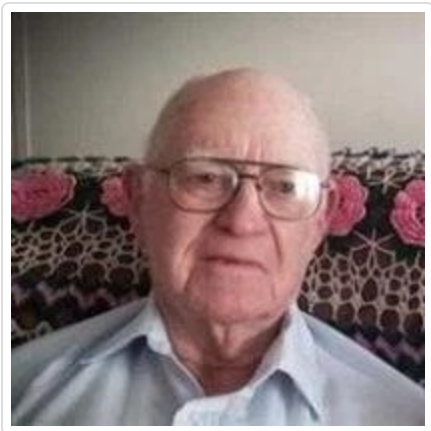




Jesse Hubert Clark

Jesse (Bo) Hubert Clark was born March 19, 1925 under a wagon, beneath a shade tree, near Charlotte, Texas.
